

## Sunlight in the Winter



What do you think about when you think of winter? You may think of cold weather. You may think of trees with no leaves. But do you think about how much sunlight there is in a day?

In the winter, there are fewer hours of sunlight in a day. The sun rises late and sets early. In fact, the day with the least sunlight is the first day of winter in the United States. It is December 21 .

# late late

## Definition

### adjective

1. happening after the usual or expected time.

*I was late to work because I missed the bus.*

2. happening near the end of a period of time.

*We got back home in the late evening.*

*It's late. Let's go to bed.*

### adverb

1. after the usual or expected time.

*The bus arrived late.*

### adjective

1. happening not long ago; recent.

*Did you hear the latest news?*

2. having recently died.

*We all loved the late Mr. Smith.*

### adverb

1. at or to a time or period near the end.

*Success came to him late in life.*

### adjective

1. towards the end of a historical era or period of time.

# sky sky

## Definition

### noun

1. the air or space above the earth.

*There are many clouds in the sky today.*

2. (often plural) the way the air above looks with respect to the weather.

*We will have blue skies this week.*

3. the uppermost level or degree.

### transitive verb

1. to throw or hit high in the air.

*The batter skied the ball to center field.*

1. The sky is dark without sunlight. The moon and the stars shine in the night sky.
2. So why do we see a bright moon in the night sky?
3. Rain falls from the sky.
4. They saw the sun come up in the sky. "Look at the sunrise," Rosie said.

### noun

1. the light of the sun; sunshine.

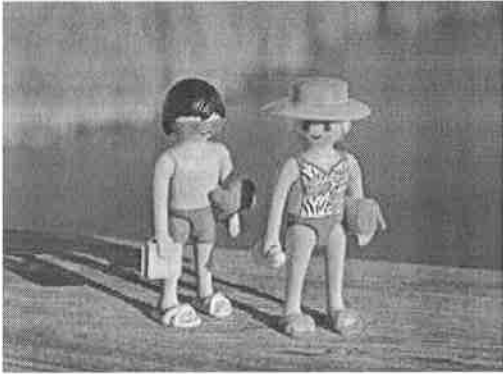
*The sunlight hurts my eyes.*
